

Is a Picture Worth a Thousand Words? Challenge

Is a picture worth a thousand words? Well, maybe, but to find out, let's literally do it!

The challenge is to write a **1000**-word text that best represents the picture that you chose from the gallery. Make sure to include very specific and accurate context so that readers fully understand the picture. Ultimately, you need to think about what message the picture was meant to portray and use your beautiful brain, along with some research, to write that message in no more than 1000 words. Use the research skills booklet provided to guide you in your research.
