

Introduction

Muse Machine is a nationally celebrated arts education organization serving more than 76,800 students and their teachers each year across 15 counties throughout central and southwestern Ohio and Kentucky since 1982.

For most students, Muse will create "a-ha!" moments by suggesting imaginative bridges to curriculum. Many will use Muse to discover culture that may have seemed out of reach. Still others will explore their own creative paths through Muse. And all will benefit by the presence of enthusiastic, innovative teachers in their classrooms.

Muse Machine partners with leading artists and arts organizations to produce a series of performances for high schools and middle schools. Muse student members at participating schools enjoy several original programs each year that bring together theatre, music, dance and film with challenging curricular concepts. The performance and Q& A run the length of a 45-minute class period and schools may invite Muse student members, all students from a particular grade, students from classes related to the subject of the performance, or even the entire school.


Purpose of the Opener
